



All 3 photos on this page are of Harold Bridges born 24th February 1899. As a child, Harrold appears on page 36 of booklet 7 of this series. He is believed to be around 16 in top left photograph on this page and 17 ½ in top right.

Harold survived World War 1 but was injured and suffered severe shell shock. He was treated in a Scottish hospital in a padded cell. He even had to be taught how to walk again. Although he lived to be 90, the trauma must have returned to him as he was afflicted in later life, dying in the now closed Three Counties asylum at Stotfold, Bedfordshire.

After the war, he returned to Wilstead and later married Gwenllyn Davies at Cardington church and they had daughter Teresa.
